The introduction of advanced special economic zones and the Free Port of Vladivostok has significantly increased the volume of FESCO's export container shipments, Vladimir Chabrov, director of the Fleet Department of Far Eastern Shipping Company, said on the eve of the EEF (TASS)

Vladivostok International Airport to handle more than 60 business flights during EEF, the airport's press service said. (RIA Novosti)

Additional security measures to be introduced in Vladivostok in connection with EEF. On 4–8 September, small vessels will not be able to navigate the Ayaks and Paris. The restrictions will extend to the use of airspace by all types of aircraft over Vladivostok. This restriction will not affect aircraft performing regular flights. (TASS)

The Primoye Territory received 35,700 tourists from South Korea over the first six months of 2017, an 80% increase from the same period of last year, and 7,200 guests from Japan, an increase of 150%, Federal Tourism Agency Director Oleg Safonov said. (Pacific Ocean Russia)

Honoka Sakhalin, a resident of the Mountain Air Advanced Special Economic Zone, will open a balneological complex in the Sakhalin Region in September. Investment in the project will amount to RUB 502 million with more than half of the investment coming from Japan. The foreign partner is the company Marusin Ivadera. (REGNUM Information Agency)

TechnoNICOL Far East, a resident of the Khabarovsk Advanced Special Economic Zone, is planning to implement a hydroponics production project. This material is used as artificial soil to plant seedlings in greenhouses. (Eastern Russia Information Agency)
